- 3. List and briefly summarize the three scenarios that Fukuyama believes may unfold as a result of new technologies.
- 4. Why does Fukuyama differentiate between biotechnology and other sectors of the economy with regard to government regulations?

Assignment 2: Daniel Callahan and Sherwin B. Nuland – **The Quagmire: How**American Medicine is Destroying Itself

Analyze

- 1. Who was René DuBos? Why do Callahan and Nuland begin their essay with a reference to him and his book?
- 2. What three key assumptions do the authors argue have been underlying the current, widely held belief that all disease can be conquered?
- 3. In your own words, briefly explain James Fries's concept of "compression of morbidity."

- 5. What, according to the authors, have the "main achievements today" in medical technology accomplished?
- 6. Why is the projected 2020 population of the American population over 65 of particular concern for the authors?
- 7. Explain the reason mentioned in the essay to support the authors' preposition that "scientific progress" is "not and endlessly affordable venture."

Assignment 3: Eric Topol - How Technology is Transforming Healthcare

Analyze
